At this critical time of our profession, *thirty nurses* are in the field today because of the foresight and generosity of our alumni association who have been raising funds relentlessly and consistently for almost four decades. A St. Luke's nurse is world-renowned and a coveted asset to any healthcare system, and the impact of our commitment will last for generations. This is the power of a coordinated and collective vision. *To date, we have a staggering \$130,000 in our Endowment; a cause for celebration!*

Thirty-eight years ago, fund-raising for St. Luke's students was limited in scope. Alumni across the globe had no unifying entity. That was when SLANFUSA was chartered by a group of devoted alumni in Chicago. The stated vision for the Charter was: To pledge and assist our Alma Mater to enhance its capacity for quality nursing education; and to yield a world class professional nurse in this age of globalization...

In 2007, the Trinity College Centennial cemented our efforts to present our Alma Mater with a distinct endowment. We used the power of numbers and our "common-unity" to push for an increase in support. This enabled us to raise even more funds behind a common cause. Today we support countless students through the Dean Ester Santos Scholarship Fund. Over \$34,000 from the proceeds of our endowment to TUA (Trinity University of Asia) since 2007 has had a lasting impact on St. Luke's graduates. Thirty students graduated and entered the field of nursing at a time when we were besieged globally by a pandemic. Our contributions, in essence changed the world!

The last installment almost got lost because of the change of SLANFUSA leadership. Luckily the check ended up with Carol Bautista our president. This singular touching story is a microcosm of the dedication and persistence to the vision and mission of SLANFUSA; and illustrates the strength of an individual's focused intention and effort.

2. The profit of a well-thought-out party.




"One Amongst Us" *
